Changes to Ambulance Victoria



As from the 1st July 2014 changes have come into force that effect Pensioners and other Health Care Card holders – where in some instances you could have to pay for the ambulance, if required to be redirected to another hospital. Charges could amount to many hundreds or even thousands of dollars.

The circumstances surrounding each case may vary and you should make sure you understand the new conditions.

Full details on ambulance fee payment responsibilities can be found in the Department of Health Guidelines on the Responsibility for payment of ambulance fees. These are available at www.health.vic.gov.au/ambulance/guidelines.

It might be a good idea to join the Vic Ambulance Membership Scheme, the cost is about \$80 per year and should avoid any complications.

Driver Behaviour near Wide Loads in Australia

Welcome to Australia's highways.

During your travels around Australia you may be confronted by vehicles displaying this large yellow sign on the roof, with yellow flashing beacons.

The width of the load could vary from **3.5 metres** to **8.5 metres**, and may be very heavy and long.

Slow down, look for a safe place to take evasive action, or stop off the road.

The more pilot vehicles and escorts, the bigger the load.

Your co-operation will be appreciated.



It is recommended you drive as close as practicable to the white line along the left edge of the tarmac known as the “fog line”. Avoid riding the centre line.

If you are following an oversize load, please take care when attempting to overtake. The truck could be much longer than you are accustomed to. This is also the case with road trains.

The decision to overtake is yours. Always assess the situation as it applies to you, before you act. It’s also recommended for caravaners to carry UHF radio and monitor channel 40 when on the highway.

Please take care on the roads, drive as carefully as you know how, according to the conditions, and be prepared to take evasive action for the unexpected.

State Rally Report – Colac

It gives me great pride and pleasure to give this Association of Caravan Clubs of Victoria State Rally 2014 report.

On 17th 18th 19th October 2014 the Association of Caravan Clubs of Victoria Inc. In conjunction with The Western District Caravan Club and the Wimmera Caravan Club of Victoria held a very successful State Rally with 96 Vans, 174 members, from 15 Victorian Clubs, met at The Central Caravan Park Colac and the P. & A. Society Show Ground. After 18 months of organising, the weekend was upon us. It was a rally of many firsts. It was the first time it had been held in this area, there were many first timers to attend the Rally. It was my first time to organise anything this big. After a brief shower the weekend turned out sunny and nice.

On Thursday we carted in tables and chairs and set up the Commerce Pavilion which was used all weekend as a meeting and eating place. Most members arrived on Friday, and after they had their vans parked and set up, they registered, and the rest of the afternoon was free to explore Colac and surrounds. Most did a spot of shopping, went to the Info centre, the gardens, and the Lake. Some just relaxed at the Park. The WDCC men, who attended the Rally were responsible for parking the vans. Members were made welcome on arrival and shown to their site. This was done so that we fitted all vans in and made members happy with their site. Every site had water and electricity.
